Pierre Guyomarc'h is a forensic anthropologist who graduated from the University of Bordeaux in 2011 with a PhD on computerized facial approximation using geometric morphometrics.

After working at the Joint POW/MIA Accounting Command Central Identification Laboratory in the USA, he joined the International Committee of the Red Cross (ICRC) for different field missions on forensic humanitarian action. He is now the deputy head of forensics at the ICRC's headquarters in Geneva, Switzerland.

His research interest include virtual anthropology, osteobiography and humanitarian forensics.

EMELINE VERNA - FRANCE



Emeline Verna is Assistant Professor at the faculty of medicine, Aix-Marseilles University in Marseille (France).

She obtained a PhD in biological anthropology from Aix-Marseilles University in 2014 on postcranial discrete traits and their contribution to the identification in forensic anthropology.

FASE ANDVANCE COURSE IN BRUXELLES

From 12th to 14th September 2019, the Forensic Anthropology Society of Europe (FASE) organized an Advanced Course in Biomechanics and Forensic Anthropology and FASE One Day Symposium.

The course took place in Brussels, a remarkably warming and easy-going city, at the Faculty of Medicine of the Université Libre de Bruxelles.

More than 90 participants from 20 countries attended the FASE Advanced Course focused on the theoretical and practical implications of biomechanics and its role in the forensic anthrology. Renowned speakers shared their knowledge and experience with the participants. This course enabled attendees to develop skills in how the latest biomechanics research in bone tissues, trauma, pathology, finite elements and gait analysis can enhance their capabilities in the forensic anthropology practice.

Besides the course, the participants had the opportunity to visit the Museum of Anatomy and Embryology in the Université Libre de Bruxelles. The museum is comprised of old

models (wax and plaster) and castings next to modern "plastinated" freshly-dissected, and virtual models of numerous anatomical and embryological specimens.

The networking and synergies between attendees and speakers elevated the FASE meeting in a friendly manner. Definitely, the FASE Advanced Course lets professionals and students with different backgrounds to acquire, enhance and exchange experience and knowledge in an inspiring and bridge-building environment.

In the end, I would like to congratulate the organizers for promoting this opportunity which, without doubt, let us looking forward to the next FASE event!

FASE BASIC COURSE IN CRETE

The host of the next Basic course in Forensic Anthropology that will be organized in September 2020 will be Crete. From 31 st august till 05 September the Medical School in Crete will be the meeting place of all interested in a basic course in forensic anthropology, and not only. The course will be continued by the traditional FASE symposium where the latest researches in the field of forensic anthropology will be presented.

A blanding of different lecturers and specialists coming from different backgrounds, but all engaged in forensic anthropology practice will guarantee an excellent introduction in the field of forensic anthropology.

The course is intended for students and practitioners at their first steps in the field of forensic anthropology from the fields of anthropology, biology, forensic medicine, archaeology etc. The course will accept up to 40 participants.

The course will be divided in two parts. Part 1 normally held in the mornings will be dedicated to oral presentations held by senior FASE members and faculty of the University of Crete, University of Athens and University of Dundee. Lectures will include a review on human osteology and odontology and will cover basic topics in forensic anthropology such as biological profile reconstruction, trauma analysis, taphonomy, positive

identification etc. 19 lectures are scheduled to date.

The second part will be dedicated to practical sessions. Each lecture topic will be discussed with hands on examples from the Cretan Collection, a contemporary collection housed at the University of Crete, the virtual collection of post-mortem CT scans of forensic anthropology cases and the experimental collection of ballistics and sharp force trauma of the Forensic Medicine Unit. A total of 5 practical sessions 2,5 hours each with a small break in between are scheduled. The Virtual Anatomy Table of the University of Crete can be made available for a session of musculoskeletal anatomy to the workshop participants.

To follow is the symposium that will be held at the same place, the 5 th September 2020.

The registration has already been opened (started the 15th January) and it can be done online through the official workshop webpage



The number of followers increased to 600 during 2019.


